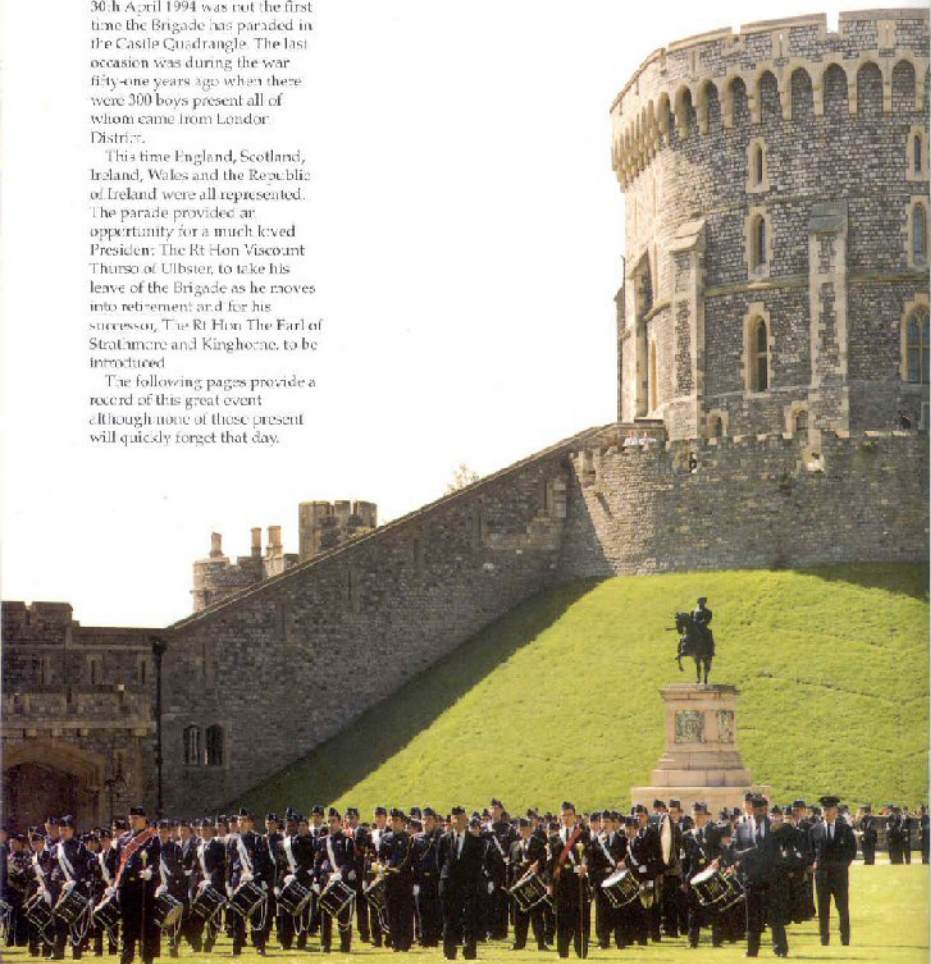
Windsor Castle

GLORIOUS weather, a unique setting, the presence of our Patron, Her Majesty The Queen and 1,100 officers and boys combined to create an historic event in the history of The Boys' Brigade. The Royal Review on 30th April 1994 was not the first time the Brigade has paraded in the Castle Quadrangle. The last occasion was during the war fifty-one years ago when there were 300 boys present all of whom came from London District.

This time England, Scotland, Ireland, Wales and the Republic of Ireland were all represented. The parade provided an opportunity for a much loved President: The Rt Hon Viscount Thurso of Ulbster, to take his leave of the Brigade as he moves into retirement and for his successor, The Rt Hon The Earl of Stratmore and Kinghorne, to be introduced.

The following pages provide a record of this great event although none of these present will quickly forget that day.



THERE were 1,100 Seniors and officers from 330 different Companies meeting for the first time on the day of the Review - could we really put on a parade fit for The Queen?

From mid morning the participants checked in at a local school where they met their parade officers and were subject to their first inspection. Just enough time to form up before moving to the Victoria Barracks, currently occupied by 1st Battalion Scots Guards, for rehearsal.

An hour or so rehearsal, a brief break for a drink, before forming up for the real thing.

The route was from Victoria Barracks, Sheet Street, Park Street into Windsor Great Park. By special permission of The Queen we were allowed to approach the Castle via the Long Walk from Cambridge Gate. A long uphill march but an impressive sight. Then into the Quadrangle.



LITTLE did I guess, in 1985 when the Executive first elected me President of The Boys' Brigade, what wonderful opportunities of service they were giving me and what warm friendships these would lead to. Now, however, the time has come to pass the baton to a younger man and I am happy that such an eminent successor as Lord Strathmore has been found to lead you. I therefore asked the Executive if I could have a parade so that I would have an opportunity to take my leave of as many boys and Companies as possible, also to mark my official handover to your new Brigade President. But now, thanks to the gracious interest of our Patron, a farewell parade has become a Royal Review and an occasion to demonstrate to Her Majesty The Queen whom we are proud to serve with loyalty and affection, that The Boys' Brigade a hundred and eleven years on is still marching bravely into the future



in the pursuit of the Object which our Founder gave us.

You are still the First and the Best for Boys - You must believe it - I know it. Thank you for eight happy years and many

kindnesses to my wife and to me. May God bless you all and prosper you in His service.

day. Only 1,200 gold badges were produced. Those with the silver anchor and surround were available more widely but this edition was limited to 2,000. Both editions are now sold out.

The badge is shaped to represent the Castle Quadrangle with the green background

representing the grass. In the centre is the BB cross and anchor and on the surround the words ROYAL REVIEW WINDSOR 1994.

These badges may be worn by boys in uniform or as a button hole badge.

Royal Review, Windsor

WELL, what can I say? Sum up the entire weekend experience in 800 to 1,000 words. Impossible. It would be an injustice to compact such a great event into a mere 1,000 words. Still, I'll give it a go.

We arrived in Reading from Exeter at about 10.00 on Friday evening after a fairly uneventful, but pleasant 3½ hour journey.

We were welcomed by an officer of the 1st Woodley Company and soon made ourselves at home in the Christ Church, Woodley, before settling down to fish and chips, and finally getting to bed at some time just after midnight, very much looking forward to the following days.

We woke up quite early on Saturday morning, and did not take long getting up. After all, we were all fully motivated and full of excited anticipation for the parade and the rest of the weekend.

After washing and a simple breakfast we began to prepare for the parade. Those officers with us from Exeter (all but one just spectators, who became known as 'silver badgers' because of their silver commemorative badges as opposed to the participants' gold) changed into uniform to spend the day in Windsor. The rest of us added the finishing touches to cleaning our uniforms. Shining shoes, brushing jackets, realising that a haversack button had not seen Duraglit since the last Royal Review and hurriedly cleaning it. A scene undoubtedly repeated across the entire South-East. All this and keeping a careful eye on the young ladies arriving for their dance class; we were busy!

The morning went quite slowly as everyone was registered at the Windsor Boys' School and inspected. The officers on parade were all issued with their briefs. We played the game of counting and trying to place the different

accents, and failed dismally! As midday approached participants gradually became hotter, but were hesitant about drinking from fear of needing the toilet later.

After arriving at the Victoria Barracks sometime around midday, our Company (number one) and others formed up and began rehearsals for the parade. At first, and with several gaps (some members arrived late and filled those gaps) most companies, ours included, looked like something reminiscent of 'Dad's Army'.

The transformation in the following 2½ hours was remarkable and a credit to the commanding officers.

The number of spectators who lined the route from the Barracks to the Castle and also inside the Quadrangle of the Castle finished off a perfect parade, demonstrating their support and encouragement for us. Many being officers, it was amusing to watch arms raised in salute as the colours were marched past sweeping like a Mexican wave through the crowd.

The Review of the Brigade in the Castle was immaculate. The parade looked excellent. Her Majesty was clearly impressed and enjoyed the event, taking time to speak with many officers and members.

In their speeches, the incoming and retiring Presidents and the Queen spoke of how memorable the parade was and reiterated their support for the Brigade. A valuable asset. As the parade moved off, I am sure that everyone shared my feeling of extreme pride and satisfaction.

A spectating officer told me afterwards that 'it looked impressive'. It fell impressive.

After several hours in uniform, we were all very hot. The weather had been gorgeous, many felt that it had been too hot. I think not, imagine how

disappointing it would have been had the weather been poor.

After freshening up back at Woodley, we returned to Windsor Boys' School for the evening concert. We were, admittedly a little apprehensive about attending the concert, not knowing what to expect. We were pleasantly surprised.

The evening was thoroughly enjoyable. From the very beginning the audience joined in, clapping, cheering, singing. Clearly determined to have a great time and make the best of a very special weekend.

There were three central acts to the concert, demonstrating above all the talent in the Brigade, and that being a Christian is not necessarily boring and dull but can be entertaining and enjoyable.

The first act, extracts from *Grease* by the 3rd Carrickfergus Company and 103rd Northern Ireland Girls' Brigade showed extreme talent. The singing and dancing was brilliant and they really kicked the show off the right way, encouraging immediate audience participation. There were obviously some budding young John Travoltas and Craig McLaughlans in the Brigade!

The second act, a former BB member turned professional, record breaking escapologist showed both talent and a new way of expressing faith by using his act as a simile for escaping from the shackles of sin. Perhaps not literally suggesting that Christians across the country should leap into strait-jackets to express their message, but using his talent to forward his belief.

The final act, the brilliant 'Phil and John' were immensely entertaining and amusing as they interspersed their singing of contemporary Christian and other music with their unique humour. Further encouraging audience participation and even

calls for an encore.

All in all, the evening was the perfect end to the perfect day. Everybody had a great time. Arms were worn out from clapping, and legs from marching, but this was all forgotten as we entered the spirit of the celebration.

The service on Sunday morning continued to demonstrate how much fun Christianity can be. We all had a good laugh and sung at the top of our voices (wearing out voices to add to Saturday's worn out bits).

Like many others, I learnt a great deal from the service. Not just how to have fun praising God, but also more about myself, and my commitment to God. A lesson which none of us should forget.

As a member, one often wonders if the Brigade President is anything more than just a name, a figurehead. Therefore, it was a great encouragement and a delight to find the Viscount Thurso showing such an interest in the Brigade. Not only attending each of the weekend's events, but willingly being photographed with members and taking time to, as far as possible, speak to everyone. We can only hope that his successor proves to be an equally competent President, as I am sure he will.

We all had a great time at Windsor, a weekend which we will all remember forever, which we should all be very proud of, and for which we owe thanks to the officers of the Brigade for organising and spending so much of their time planning. We do appreciate your continuous hard work, be it in planning events like the Review, or equally important company evenings.

I think the one thing which I shall remember most is the fellowship which bound everyone be they Royalty, President, Parade Commander, Queensman, officer, member, or spectator as equals in one, several thousand strong family - The Boys' Brigade - which enabled us

to have such a great time, and for which we thank God.

May that fellowship continue to bind the Brigade together, in the same way forever.

TWO more days to go until we would leave Glastry to travel to Windsor for the Royal Review. For me this is when it suddenly clicked that we were actually going to be part of this historic occasion. our President spoke to us so nicely I felt so proud to have been a part of this event.

When we got back to our rooms to change we were exhausted and inside a few hours we were on our way back to the airport and we arrived back home in Glastry about midnight. My bed that night never felt so good, I was exhausted.

My day at Windsor was very memorable but when you get home and look back it's only then you realise just how great it all had been and what a great honour it had been for us to have been a part of it all. It was a day I'll never ever forget.

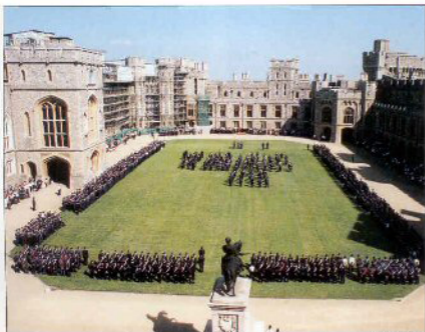

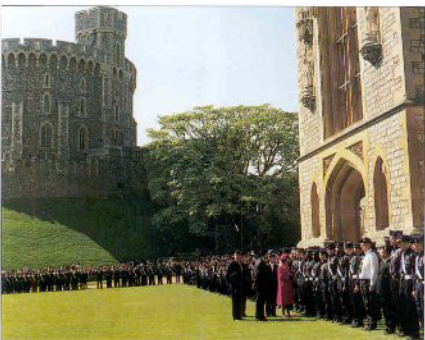

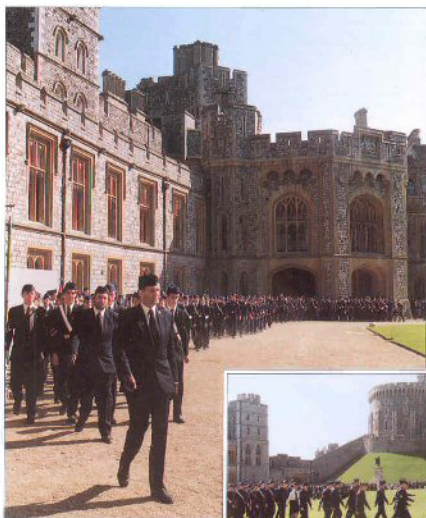
