



for members of the LONDON DISTRICT BUGLE BAND - for GLASGOW VISIT August 25th-29th 1983.





The London Massed BUGLE BAND will have 514 playing members and will be accompanied by 70 Officers.

We shall be travelling on TWO special Trains.

ALL MEMBERS of the BAND are to assemble at EUSTON STATION (London) by 9.30 am on Thursday August 25th - please DO NOT BE LATE.

- * Ensure that all your belongings are in a strong holdall or case which must be CLEARLY LABELLED with your name and Company.
- * Each person must be able to carry <u>all</u> his own kit for transit purposes.
- * BUGLERS are to carry their own Bugles at all times.
- * For travelling we shall all wear the special London Band SWEATSHIRTS everybody please.
- * Bring a PACKED LUNCH we don't reach Scotland until 4.30pm
- * When travelling NO SMOKING No OPENING of DOORS and NO sticking heads out of windows.
- * ALL your equipment and belongings should be clearly labelled with your name and Company. This is important.

Things you Must Take ...

Everyone must be able to carry all their own kit. Therefore we recommend that you take one good strong holdall or case - clearly labelled with your name and Company.

Make sure you have

Sleeping Bag ... Pyjamas ... small pillow if you need one... Hand towel ... flannel ... soap (in bag) ... toothbrush and paste ... hairbrush and comb ... handkerchieves ... socks ... underwear ... Swimming gear ... large towel ... extra thick pullover or windcheater ... tea towel ... knife, fork, spoon cereal dish, dinner and tea plates, mug and egg cup ... clothes hanger ... stamped addressed envelope/card home ... pencil/biro ... Bible etc... cleaning kit for your uniform.. pair of trainers for soccer etc ... macintosh to wear during rehearsals if it rains. Spare shirts, trousers etc etc


ALSO TAKE B.B. full uniform and black shoes - and black or dark blue socks. Uniform must be perfect.

IF YOU CAN ... ALSO TAKE an AIR BED or Camp Bed, BUT YOU must be able to carry it with your other kit.

.... and of course BAND INSTRUMENTS carefully protected.

Remember -

Band Instruments are ONLY to be played when one of the Band Officers authorises - there must be NO playing on the trains or at any time other than during the rehearsals or the actual performances.



MONEY
