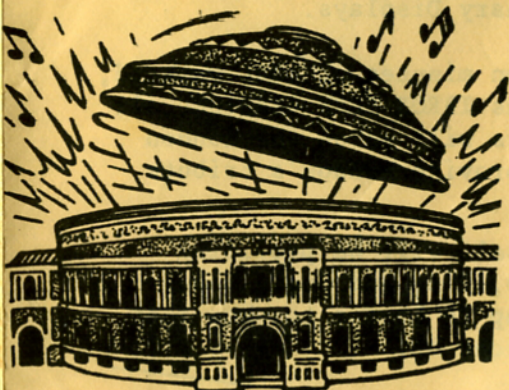

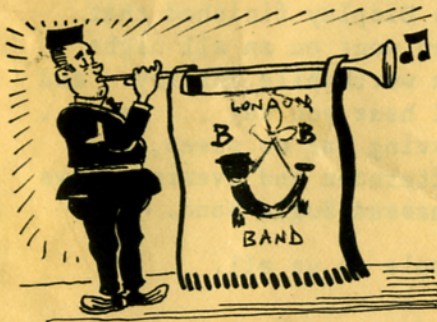
From all reports the 1982 Display was a great success - we hear it pleased all the spectators.

AUGUST '83!

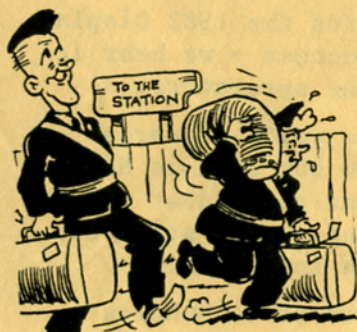


Some way North of Watford is a strange Land full of Scottish people.

A great weekend of special Centenary events, displays, Parades and Services will be held in Glasgow - where 45,000 people are expected to attend the Centenary Displays.



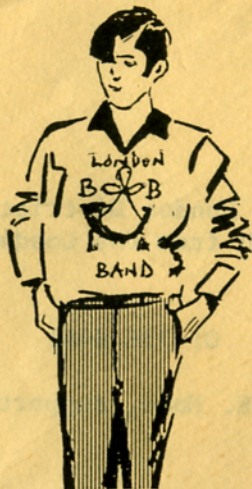
For about ten minutes of that weekend, in the famous IBROX PARK STADIUM, all eyes and ears will be on the London Band as we provide London's tribute to Scotland.
